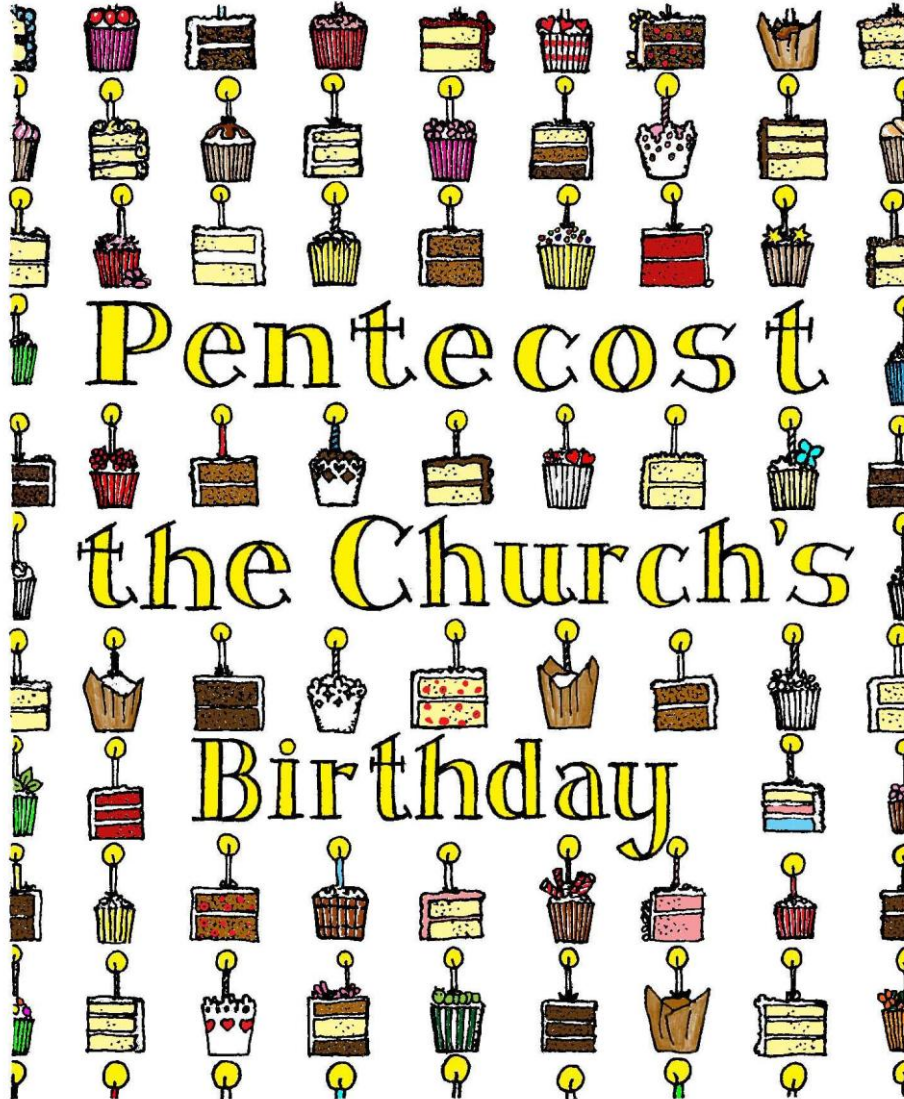

From Mark Binney Priest in Charge



It's another World Cup and football fever is running high! They say that football is almost a religion these days. It certainly has its dedicated followers and vast numbers of them. There is almost a Cathedral-like atmosphere in a huge stadium at a big match. The impression becomes stronger still when the crowd sings 'Abide with me'. Football supporters strongly support their team with a passion which puts many Church congregations to shame.

On the pitch the eleven players work as a team putting into practice all the moves the coach has taught them. They have learned the rules of the game and follow them because they know the game will descend into chaos otherwise. One person has the responsibility for ensuring that the rules are followed and interpreted correctly in any given situation on the pitch. That person is the referee.

At the Last Supper Jesus prepares his team, his first eleven and the rest of the squad, for the game of their lives. Although he has trained his squad, and coached them for the fixture that lies ahead, he will not be with them on the pitch. His job is almost done but he promises to send them a referee. Someone who will help them interpret what he has been teaching them, in any situation in which they might find themselves. Jesus is returning to the Father but he will send the Spirit of truth to guide his followers.

At Pentecost the Spirit descends upon the disciples just as Jesus had promised. Referees are not always popular. Players do not always agree with their decisions. And in the world today people still resist the Spirit. For the Holy Spirit is not always a comfortable companion. He comes to jolt us out of our complacency, to challenge the world, to search our hearts, most of all to point us to Jesus.

The Holy Spirit is still moving in the Church today. We need continually to ask for the guidance of the Holy Spirit in our Worship, in church meetings and in our daily lives. Like the referee interpreting the rules of the game in specific situations, the Spirit will show us how the teaching of Jesus can be applied. A good referee allows a game to flow, only stepping in when there is conflict, and reminding players of the rules. In that way he encourages them to use to the full the skills their coach has taught them, which in turn brings credit to the coach. If we listen to the Holy Spirit we can bring credit to our teacher. We can work on his behalf and play the game he would want us to play.

Big Bible Study 2014

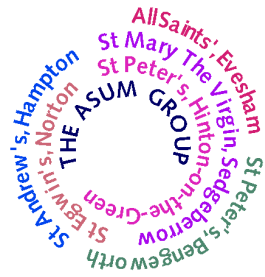

Annual Report of the Great and Little Hampton Educational Charity May 2014

The untimely passing this last year of our fellow trustee, Gordon Grove, will be deeply felt, we are sure, by the whole Evesham community. Gordon gave freely of his time to so many activities in the town. He was the highly valued vice-chairman of our Hampton charity and we will sorely miss his wise counsel in our decisions on financial and educational matters. Never sombre or grave, his unfailing optimism and cheerful manner helped to ensure that our meetings proceeded happily as well as efficiently. He will long live in our memories.

We used part of our income this year to contribute in his memory £100 towards the creation of a commemorative garden and bench at Prince Henry's, the school he'd attended for his own secondary education and to which he later gave so many years of valuable service as a member of the academic staff.

On routine matters, the value of the charity's fund continues to grow. In March last year it stood at £ 63,593; on March 31st this year it totals £65,471.

Our total income was £2,572. We spent £2,100 on 29 student applications.

Expenses, including the clerk's honorarium, came to £262. We donated £100 to the commemorative garden at Prince Henry's where pupils will be able to find a quiet spot during the school day. We also put another £500 in the investment shares to help safeguard the value of the grants for future generations of Hampton students. Finally we would like to welcome Mrs Helen Keeley of Cheltenham Road as our new trustee. She brings a wealth of experience as a parent of children who've gone through the local education system and as an ex-member of staff at both High Schools in the town. Helen, we're sure, will be a most valuable addition to our small band of trustees.

The Electoral Roll has been updated and now stands at 82.

Daniel Lewis and Susan Wakefield were re-elected as Deanery Representatives, and Ray Edwards, Carolyn Jenkins and Jane Wisniewski were elected to the PCC for a period of three years.

There has been no further work done towards the redevelopment plans, as the need for urgent roof repairs has taken priority for the coming year. However, the PCC is still committed to the provision of toilets and kitchen facilities in the Church building. St Andrew's Church Centre (Formally St Richard's Hall) was refurbished with new toilets and kitchen and it looks great.

Looking back over 2013, it was reported that the Tots group are doing very well and Alphabet House continues to use our Church Centre. Open the Book is provided at St Andrew's School and is organised by one of the parents.

The Christmas cards were a great success despite some of them going to another 'Fairfield' in the Diocese. A bemused vicar telephoned Mark about them arriving on his desk. The mistake was duly corrected.

There were good attendances at the Crib and Midnight Mass services on Christmas Eve.

The Vicar commented on how well used St Andrew's was, with baptisms, weddings and funerals taking place throughout the year. He thanked everyone who had helped in any way with the life of St Andrew's church and our church centre during 2013.

John Martin 300th Anniversary 2014

This year it will be three hundred years since the death of John Martin, who was born in 1637, and died at the age of 77 in 1714.

John Martin had been a yeoman farmer living in Hampton, when he died leaving a wife, but no surviving children. After providing for his wife, in his will he established trusts to benefit the people of Hampton, Bengeworth and Evesham. There was an emphasis on giving young people a good education and Christian upbringing, and also helping the poor of the parishes. Thus the John Martin Charity was born.

Originally the main asset of the Charity was John Martin's land, amounting to around 80 acres. The rental income from this land through agricultural and market garden tenancies produced a modest income over the first 250 years and the Charity operated in a small but valuable way during this time. As the town of Evesham expanded, the majority of the land was developed. This produced a larger capital sum for investment and it is these investments, which continue to generate the Charity's income. With more income becoming available, the scope of the charity was widened in 1981 to benefit the town and neighbourhood of Evesham. The four main aims remain: Propagation of the Christian Gospel, Relief in Need, Promotion of Education and Health.

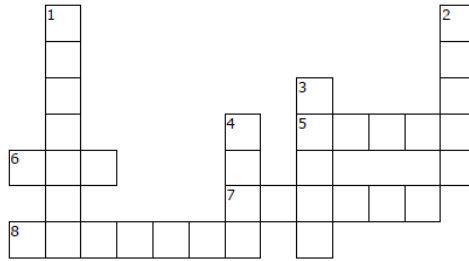

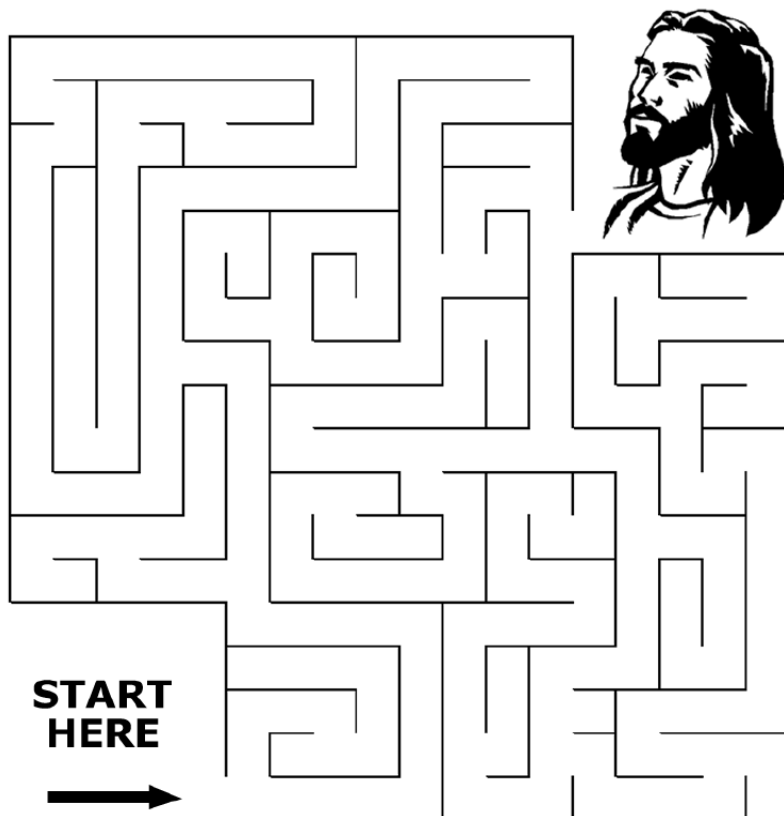

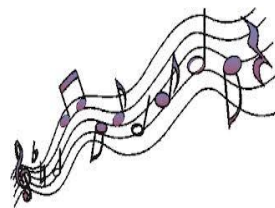
