Missioner News

SPLISH!...SPLASH!...SPLOSH!

There are loads of new things happening from September, here is a brief explanation of them all.

SPLISH! As you may know St Andrew's has a toddler group called St. Andrew's Tots (Tuesdays) and All Saints has a toddler group called Bright Sparks (Wednesdays). St Peter's are planning a weekly Toddler Service called SPLISH! (Thursdays), which means that the three town churches have something for toddlers and their families, which are all different in content and style. In addition to this St. Peter's has had permission from the PCC to put a baby changing station in the disabled toilet and to buy furniture to create a special children's corner. The first Splish! will be held on Thursday September 18th at 10 – 11 am.

Would **you** like to help run Splish!?

SPLASH! For 4 – 11 year olds there will be a monthly Children's service called SPLASH! For quite a while All Saints have run *very* successful workshops for children at relevant times throughout the year, usually on a Saturday or Sunday afternoon, with lots of creative activities around a central theme, such as Harvest or Christingle. We are going to be working on this success and extending it to be monthly, on a Sunday afternoon (3 – 4.30 pm) and are going to promote it in all age relevant schools across the whole of Evesham. The first one is to be held on Sunday September 21st.

Would **you** like to be involved with this?

SPLOSH! 11 upwards. There is already a really great weekly youth group at St. Peter's, which has been renamed Splosh! (instead of Youth Group) which will be Asum wide and will be for the children who eventually grow too old for Splash! and those coming through the Confirmation courses. Thursdays 7 pm (Term Time only)

Christianity Explored and Alpha:

St. Peter's is hosting a Christianity Explored course and we will be inviting people to come along and learn more about the Christian faith, following a simple shared meal. (The Alpha Course is to be run from February 2015). We will continue each year to alternate one course with the other so that each year people have two opportunities to learn more. The first Christianity Explored evening is Tuesday 9th September at 7 pm.

Are **you** interested in helping either with a group or with helping to provide the food and refreshments?

Baptism Preparation:

A monthly baptism preparation course at St. Peter's. St Peter's new system means that people can book their baptism *provisionally* with the office and complete forms in the normal way, then come along to the evening to have their event



confirmed. The family will be invited to the first of the month service to collect their child's baptism candle. We are going to use CPAS's DVD called 'First Steps' as an aid to unpack what baptism is all about. The first one is on Monday 29th September, 2014 at 7 pm.

Want to be part of the Baptism Prep team?

Evening Worship:

All Saints will be host to a weekly evening service. The service is ecumenical. Our aim is that whether you are churched, de-churched or unchurched there will be something you can relate to. A simple meal will be followed by an explanation of the central theme and expansion of which will be through a variety of creative prayer stations and a 2 minute summing up at the end. There will also be opportunity to receive prayer. This is still in the planning stages, although there is already a list of about 18 people who want to take a turn at planning one of these services. The first one is being held on Sunday 21st September at 6.30 pm.

Fancy bringing your creative worship ideas out? Want to be included in a team?

Open the Book:

Open the book is expanding in the new term and we are looking for people to come forward and be part of the team who will go into the schools to act out bible stories for the children in their assemblies. Is this you?

Domus:

(Latin for house) An informal and contemplative act of 'worship at home' at 1 Broadway Road. It is a follow on from the start of the year when I offered Morning Prayer and croissants. Simple acts of worship, prayer and a shared meal. This has been created after several conversations with various people across the Asum Group. The first one is on Sunday 14th September (and second Sundays thereafter) at 11.30 am concluding around 1.30 pm.

Holy Days in September

September 25 - St Ceolfrith (d 716) - Baking and Bibles

Ceolfrith is a good patron saint for anyone who has studied hard for their profession, is strong in the face of tragedy, and who can also offer some homely care to others in need.

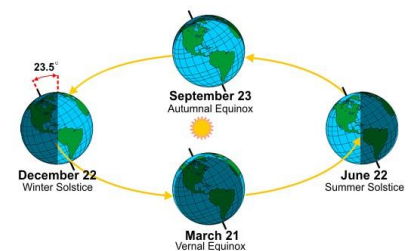
This well-loved abbot of Wearmouth and Jarrow came from a noble Northumbrian family, and was ordained at Ripon when he was just 27. He travelled to Canterbury and Icanho (in East Anglia) where he studied ecclesiastical and monastic practices. But back at Ripon the monks soon came to appreciate him for another good reason: Ceolfrith was an outstanding cook. They asked him to be the monastery's baker, and he agreed.

In time Ceolfrith was moved on to Wearmouth, and then in 682, when the monastery at nearby Jarrow was founded, Ceolfrith became abbot. It was here that disaster struck, when a plague killed all of the monks who could sing or read. Only Ceolfrith and the boy Bede were left alive. It would have been so easy to flee that empty house of death, but instead, Ceolfrith and the young Bede faithfully stayed on, because they believed God had called them to be there. Soon Jarrow prospered once more, and by 689 Ceolfrith was made abbot of both Wearmouth and Jarrow. Ceolfrith seems to have been a kindly and energetic leader. During his rule 600 monks joined the monastery, the library was doubled, and the endowments increased. But Ceolfrith's biggest legacy to history came when he commissioned from his own scriptoria three Pandects (complete Bibles in single volumes) in uncial script. One still survives today, as the Codex Amiatinus, an enormous volume in the Bibiloteca Laurenziana in Florence. It is the oldest surviving complete Latin Bible in one volume.

A kindly baking abbot who also happened to leave us the earliest complete Latin Bible – not a bad combination of skills!

September 23 - When the sun goes edgewise – and daytime equals night

September 23 is the autumnal equinox (if you live in the northern hemisphere) or the vernal (Spring) equinox (if you live in the southern hemisphere) The equinoxes occur in March and September, when the Sun is 'edgewise' to the Earth's axis of rotation, so that everywhere on earth has twelve hours of daylight and twelve hours of darkness.

Hampton WI – July 2014

Our visit to the Guide Dogs National Breeding Centre near Leamington this month was a great success. The only slight disappointment was that we had to view the puppies through glass, though of course we understood the need to protect them from the risk of infection. However, we were able to meet a very handsome Golden Retriever stud dog, called Lewis, who has so far fathered over 80 puppies, and were lucky enough to see a litter of puppies born only 3 days before. We also tried out the sensory tunnel, which we walked through blindfolded. This gave us the opportunity to hear everyday sounds and experience with our fingertips different textures on the walls and smooth and rough surfaces beneath our feet, when we were unable to see. It was very thought provoking and reinforced the message from the people on the DVD's we were shown, who spoke of the transformation there had been in their lives since having a guide dog.

At this month's meeting we had a fascinating and amusing talk from Francis Smith on his time as a BBC Props Buyer. Among the many programmes he was involved with were Miss Marple (with one of the episodes being filmed in Barbados - lucky Francis), Butterflies and As Time Goes By. It was interesting to gain an insight into how such programmes were made and how much attention is given to the smallest details to ensure continuity.

Hampton WI – August 2014

We met on 12 August for our afternoon tea meeting and the tables looked very attractive, laid with the pretty china cups and saucers members had brought. Cake stands with a variety of dainty sandwiches and home made scones and cakes were placed on each table, together with a pot of tea. It was all very enjoyable.

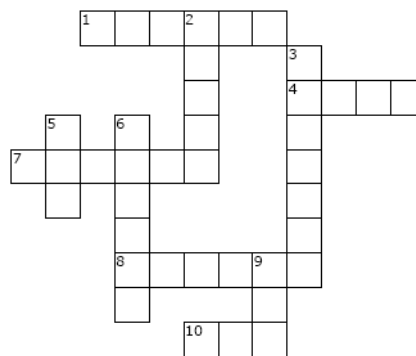

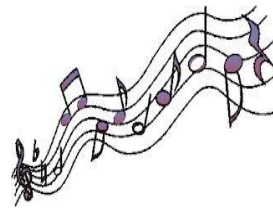
