## **A letter from the Archdeacon of Worcester for July editions of Parish Magazines**

By the time you read this we will know whether the UK has voted In or Out, though at the time of writing I'm still being assailed from both sides wanting my vote! However, as we saw in the Scottish referendum, the results aren't the end of the story. There are always further negotiations to take place and, perhaps more importantly for us all, relationships to be built and even re-built.

This process also happens within churches and in families. Opinions are one thing, but relationships count too. Often it comes down to key individuals going that one extra step and reaching out to the other side. As Christians we are surely in the business of taking the extra step, and more if needed.

We saw this in the negotiations over the Good Friday agreement about the future of Northern Ireland, where sworn enemies sat down together for what they perceived to be a greater good. We see Pope Francis reaching out to all sorts of people who feel alienated from the Church and using the media to great effect in doing so. I guess for him it was not so much a case of the greater good as the greater God! He seems to rest at peace and with integrity within his understanding of a God who gives him space to take such courageous steps and live up to one of his titles, pontifex or bridge-builder.

God is always greater than we can imagine or conceive. Our words can only hint at who this God is. That is why the Church has worshipped Him down the centuries in the beauty of holiness, using poetry and music, liturgy and architecture to express that to which our words cannot do full justice. This beauty is not a sort of cultural captivity: there is a powerful Christian tradition of beautiful worship in beautiful settings leading to beautiful lives being lived to the full.

Those who have worshipped Him in the beauty of holiness have discovered that same holiness in the rough and tumble of daily life. Bishop Frank Weston, speaking at an Anglo-Catholic congress nearly a hundred years ago, told his listeners: 'You cannot claim to worship Jesus in the Tabernacle, if you do not pity Jesus in the slums. . . It is folly, it is madness, to suppose that you can worship Jesus in the Sacraments and Jesus on the throne of glory, when you are sweating him in the souls and bodies of his children.'

Love of God goes hand in hand with love of neighbour. Finding space for our spacious God surely enlarges our heart enough to go out to those we love and those we find it hard to love, and maybe makes us those bridge-builders and reconcilers which the world needs.

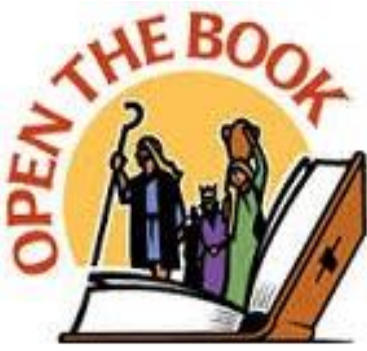

## **\*\*\* ROOF UPDATE \*\*\***

You may be aware that St Peters Church Hinton on the Green is currently undergoing critical repairs to its tower roof. This week the Hinton PCC has been given, what feels like “a kick in the teeth” from the Architect.

We have received a revised schedule of works due to the sorry state of the string course. Unfortunately, some of the works within the original specification and tender were based on, educated estimates, as the true state of the Tower could not be determined until the scaffolding was erected and the parapet wall dismantled to get a closer look. The contractors have reported that the flaunching and string course are in a very poor state and require urgent attention, and that repairs to the string course are absolutely necessary to ensure long term waterproofing to the Tower. This will mean an additional cost of £10,000 Having received a grant of £98,100 from the LPOW and putting in £12,800 of our own money, which was raised over 4 years of fundraising, we have six weeks to find a further £10,000. As I am sure you are fully aware that puts any grant applications out of the window due to the time frame we have. Therefore we are looking for short term funding opportunities.

We have set up our own crowdfunding page, which will run for 30 days only.

Michelle Young spent 4 hours in the tower at St Peters with the workers from Midland Conservation on the 23 May. She took some great photos of the shockingly very poor condition of our tower roof. The whole structure is completely rotten. Here are a few of the pictures she took:



The main wall plate on the side of the tower facing the road. It's just dust now due to lack of drainage (LHS). The hatch from the bells onto the roof. The condition of it meant it took no effort for the whole hatch and surround to be lifted out, and this was the most stable bit of the roof! (RHS)



A main supporting lump of wood (LHS). A previous attempt at repairing the timbers has taken place; you can see where the rafters have been braced (RHS)

## Hampton WI – June 2016

At our June meeting some members were wearing red, white and blue in honour of the Queen's (official) 90th birthday. A birthday card had been sent to Her Majesty, we were delighted to have received a letter of thanks, with a lovely photograph.

Several members had joined the Group outing to the Birmingham Canals for a thoroughly enjoyable day. There was plenty of exercise, climbing the steps to the bridges over the canals, and we had fun in the BBC Mailbox Public Space, recording items of news or the weather report. We particularly enjoyed our tour of the Council Chamber with a knowledgeable guide. On 22 June we are looking forward to a friendly skittles match at Pershore Sports Club, and in July we will visit Toddington WI, who will be preparing lunch for us.

Our speaker was Judy Dale, who related some 'Tales from the Stones'; the stones in question belonging to Pershore Abbey. The original Abbey was destroyed by fire in the 11th century and had been rebuilt, but two more major fires followed; one in 1223, which also spread to part of the town, and another which caused the tower to collapse onto the presbytery roof. The Abbey was rebuilt, and we saw slides showing the beautiful vaulting over the nave and the ornate roof bosses, which had been restored by Sir George Gilbert Scott, a Victorian architect. Also there was a Norman font, which had been replaced in Victorian times but in 1921 was found in a garden in Kempsey, and after cleaning was restored to its rightful place.

In the 10th century, the relics of St Edburgha, granddaughter of Alfred the Great, were purchased and enshrined in the Abbey. The relics were claimed to have healing properties, and the Abbey became a popular place of pilgrimage in the Middle Ages. During the Dissolution of the Monasteries, the people of Pershore managed to save part of the Abbey to be their parish church.

Pam Wills gave the vote of thanks on behalf of us all for Judy's most interesting talk.

We then toasted HM the Queen with a glass of Bucks Fizz, and wished her a Happy Birthday and enjoyed a slice of the delicious cakes made by Ann Evans and Liz Rodway.

Our competition winner for **something beginning with 'I'**, was Liz Rodway with an **Indian** purse which had been brought back by her father from WW11.

Next month Andy Pedrick will speak to us about 'Gardening'. There will be an opportunity to ask questions. The competition will be for an item **beginning with 'K'**.
