

Asum Group Bulletin – March 2017 Spring Germinating

Do you know anyone who would like to start up their own business – but need support to make it happen? How can we encourage people of working age to remain in rural areas to make a living?

Well, now, local Churches like ours have been offered the resources to help respond practically and pastorally to these questions.



Chris Sheehan, ordinand based at All Saints, shared a vision for this new initiative - the Germinate Enterprise Scheme - which is supported by Prince's Countryside Fund.

Chris explained that in most communities there are people who would love to set up their own small business or social

enterprise, but lack confidence and the practical skills needed to choose an idea and work out whether it is viable.

Germinate Enterprise is a resource that churches or other groups can use to help their community flourish through job creation, retaining young and working age residents and tackling rural poverty.

Given the growing availability of high speed broadband, the need that many farmers have to diversify, and the availability of business skills in many congregations, there is a unique opportunity to reach out and offer a resource of real benefit.



The members of your Asum Group Council have welcomed this initiative enthusiastically – especially as Chris himself is both qualified and willing to take the lead in it!

At this stage, we are asking everyone in our Asum churches network to help in three ways...

- 1. Is there someone you know who would like to start up their own small business?
- 2. Do you or someone you know have experience or skills that might be useful in mentoring people who are just starting out in business? Marketing? Health & safety? Accounting? Strategy? etc?

We are really hoping that at least one or two people will come from each church in the Group.



Iona Retreat – Bishop's House

Advance Notice: 18 - 22 September 2018

'Journeying Together': a continuing exploration into Celtic Spirituality on Iona.

Led by Richard and Maggi Deimel

Maggi and Richard Deimel are Anglican priests. For 17 years they helped lead a group of churches around Studley, Warwickshire. In 2010 they moved back to the North to lead a group of churches based around the ancient Celtic sanctuary at Escomb. They took early retirement from parish ministry two year's ago to live high in the North Pennines and concentrate on their work as Advisers on New Spiritual Movements for the North-Eastern dioceses. This involves leading retreats and pilgrimages to ancient Celtic sacred sites, as well as hosting a spiritual gathering called Celtic Hearth around their cottage and land. Richard and Maggi's passion is holding safe spaces where people can together go deeper on their spiritual journey, especially in places like the Holy Island of Lindisfarne and Iona, where the veil is thin.

Iona is a tiny island off the southwest coast of Mull in the Inner Hebrides. It is only 1.5 miles wide by 3 miles long, with a population of around 120 permanent residents. Despite this, Iona has a special place in the heart of many people the world over.

Iona has a long and illustrious history and is well known as being 'The cradle of Christianity' in Scotland. While that is without doubt one of the main reasons that a reported 130,000 visitors come to Iona each year, there is much more to the island than that. It is striking to remark that despite the numbers of visitors to the island, the pervading feeling that people leave with is one of peace and restoration. In 2016 a group of us travelled to the Holy Island of Lindisfarne to discover Celtic Christianity. It was a very positive experience and in light of that, a further retreat has been organised to Iona, staying in Bishops House. The theme for the retreat is 'Journeying Together' and will run from the Tuesday to Saturday. There may also be an opportunity to stay over in Glasgow for a day on the way up.

There are 20 places available, 7 singles and 8 doubles. There are no en-suites, but there are plenty of bathrooms and when I last visited there was never a queue to use any of the facilities. The rooms are very pleasant with amazing views.

The cost of the retreat (<u>not</u> including travel) will be £310 per person, which isn't bad for full catering and accommodation. Non-returnable deposits of £150 will need to be taken as soon as possible to secure the booking and then two further payments of £80 each later in the year. (Or you could pay the whole amount in one go if you wished)

St Patrick - beloved apostle to Ireland - 17 March

St Patrick is the patron saint of Ireland. If you've ever been in New York on St Patrick's Day, you'd think he was the patron saint of New York as well... the flamboyant parade is full of American/Irish razzmatazz.

It's all a far cry from the hard life of this 5th century humble Christian who became in time both bishop and apostle of Ireland. Patrick was born the son of a town councillor in the west of England, between the Severn and the Clyde. But as a young man he was captured by Irish pirates, kidnapped to



Ireland, and reduced to slavery. He was made to tend his master's herds.

Desolate and despairing, Patrick turned to prayer. He found God was there for him, even in such desperate circumstances. He spent much time in prayer, and his faith grew and deepened, in contrast to his earlier years, when he "knew not the true God".

Then, after six gruelling, lonely years he was told in a dream he would soon go to his own country. He either escaped or was freed, made his way to a port 200 miles away and eventually persuaded some sailors to take him with them away from Ireland.

After various adventures in other lands, including near-starvation, Patrick landed on English soil at last, and returned to his family. But he was much changed. He had enjoyed his life of plenty before; now he wanted to devote the rest of his life to Christ. Patrick received some form of training for the priesthood, but not the higher education he really wanted.

But by 435, well educated or not, Patrick was badly needed. Palladius' mission to the Irish had failed, and so the Pope sent Patrick back to the land of his slavery. He set up his see at Armagh, and worked principally in the north. He urged the Irish to greater spirituality, set up a school, and made several missionary journeys.

Patrick's writings are the first literature certainly identified from the British Church. They reveal sincere simplicity and a deep pastoral care. He wanted to abolish paganism, idolatry, and was ready for imprisonment or death in the following of Christ.

Patrick remains the most popular of the Irish saints. The principal cathedral of New York is dedicated to him, as, of course, is the Anglican cathedral of Dublin.

She aims to help others to work with chocolate, and to this end, runs workshops, for both adults and children at her Wickhamford base. At the end of her talk, Yvonne had brought along a range of her decorative chocolate gifts.

The competition, for an item beginning with 'Y', was won by Ann Evans, with her yellow-themed breakfast tray, including yogurt and egg yolk!




