Letter from the Dean of Worcester

Using social media responsibly

Social media have become a way of life for many people. And like any way of life, social media are an opportunity and a danger. Social media can do good and can cause harm. Using social media well is a craft that needs to be learnt.

The Church of England has recently put forward ten guidelines for the good and positive use of social media. While designed for those using church social media accounts, they are simple guidelines that we would all be the better for following.

Be safe. The safety of children, young people and vulnerable adults must be maintained.

Be respectful. Do not post or share content that is sexually explicit, inflammatory, hateful, abusive, threatening or otherwise disrespectful.

Be kind. Treat others how you would wish to be treated and assume the best in people. If you have a criticism or critique to make, consider not just *whether* you would say it in person, but the tone you would use.

Be honest. Don't mislead people about who you are.

Take responsibility. You are accountable for the things you do, say and write. Text and images shared can

be public and permanent, even with privacy settings in place.

Be a good ambassador. Personal and professional life can easily become blurred online so think before you post.

Disagree well. Some conversations can be places of robust disagreement and it's important we apply our values in the way we express them.

Credit others. Respect copyright and always credit

where it is due. Be careful not to release sensitive or confidential information and always question the source of any

content you are considering amplifying.

Follow the rules. Abide by the terms and conditions of the various social media platforms themselves.

It would take very little effort on the part of any of us to stick to these. But a huge amount of unhappiness could be avoided, if we did. Some people would not be permanently damaged. Even some lives would be saved.

Annually, on the second Saturday in September, cyclists, pedestrians, horse riders and motorists descend on Britain's roads and footpaths to take part in the

sponsored Ride & Stride event, fundraising for their local County Churches Trust. This annual event provides the main source of income for each Trust and enables them to make grants to churches in need. Ride & Stride is inter-denominational, and participants are invited to seek sponsors who pay an agreed amount for each place of worship visited by bike, foot, horse or car on the day, between 10am and 6pm.

The many volunteers across the nation who wait in churches and chapels to record the visits of all the riders and striders are as incredibly important as those who take part in the event and sponsor it. This great event is a real community effort and is central to the work of the Trust. In the twenty years since the churches in this county have been involved, more than 200 have received grants for much-needed building repairs or fabric improvement. The money raised by each participant is shared equally between the Worcestershire and Dudley Historic Churches Trust and a nominated place of worship.

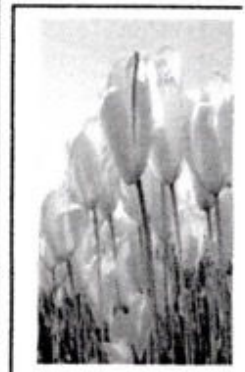

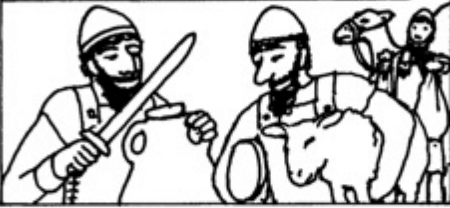
Bible Bite

A Recipe from my time with family in Australia

Caramel and Date Self-Saucing Pudding

Ingredients

60g butter
125ml milk
225g dark muscovado sugar
85g coarsely chopped dates
150g self-raising flour
435 ml boiling water



Method

- Set the oven at 180deg C.
- Mix butter, milk, 155g of sugar and the dates in a saucepan.
- Heat over a low heat, and cook for 2-3 minutes, stirring all the time.
- Remove from the heat, and stir in the flour.
- Put the mix into six 185ml ovenproof dishes.
- Sprinkle remaining sugar over the puddings.
- Pour the boiling water evenly over the puddings.
- Place on an over-proof tray and bake for 25-30 minutes.
- Remove from the oven and cool slightly for 10 minutes.
- Serve with a scoop of vanilla ice cream.

Autumn Equinox

23 September is the autumnal equinox (if you live in the northern hemisphere) or the vernal (Spring) equinox (if you live in the southern hemisphere) The equinoxes occur in March and September, when the Sun is 'edgewise' to the Earth's axis of rotation, so that everywhere on earth has twelve hours of daylight and twelve hours of darkness.
