Letter from the Dean of Worcester, Peter Atkinson

This year the whole of March falls within Lent. That makes it too late to talk about Ash Wednesday and how we should be keeping Lent, and too early to talk about Easter, the great day for which Lent is the time of preparation. So instead, let's remind ourselves that the word 'Lent' is an old English word simply meaning 'spring'. In other languages, the word for Lent refers to the forty days (such as the French Carême) or the season of fasting (such as the German Fastenzeit). Our language invites us to ponder the fact that Lent and Easter occur in the spring.

The connection to new life and rebirth is obvious. As the natural world comes back to life, as leaves and flowers appear, as animals come out of hibernation, as the days lengthen and we spend more time out of doors, so too Christians celebrate the new spiritual life that flows from the dying and rising of Our Lord Jesus Christ. In St John's Gospel, Jesus compares his own death and resurrection to the planting of a seed: 'Truly, truly, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains alone;

but if it dies, it bears much fruit . now, when I am lifted up from the earth, I will draw all people to myself' (John 12: 24, 32). He is the seed, buried in the earth, but raised up in glory, extending his risen life to all who follow him.

In the natural world, plants produce more seeds, which in turn produce more plants. So too the followers of Jesus are not only the 'fruit' of Jesus's death and resurrection, we are that new generation of seeds which must be planted in order to bear more fruit . Each Christian life is a life of dying and rising. Each Christian life replicates the pattern of Christ's dying and rising. 'We die with him', says St Paul, 'in order that we may live with him'. How do we 'die'? We die to self, we die to selfish and self-destructive instincts, we die to all that separates us from Christ. And how do we 'live'? We gratefully remember the promise of Jesus that he has come that we may have life, and may have it in all its fullness. We allow the risen life of Christ to live in us.

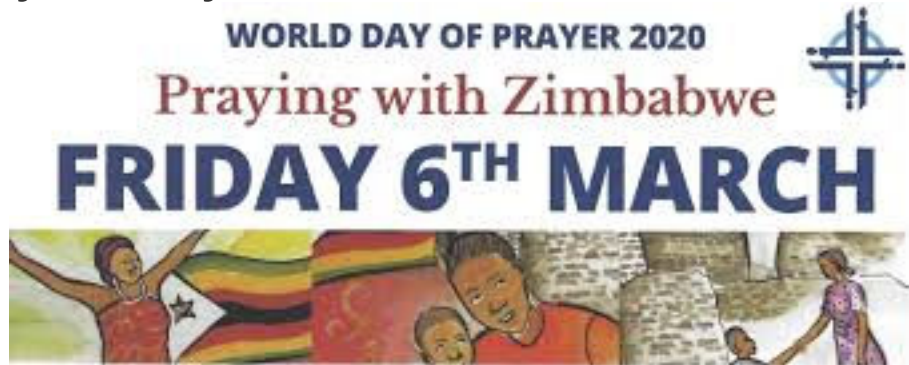

World Day of Prayer



Rise, take your mat and walk

Women, men and children of all ages are called to 'Rise, take your mat and walk' to join this day of prayer.

The Women of Zimbabwe have prepared this year's service, and they encourage us all to reflect on the difficulties and unrest that have plagued their country over many years. They share the challenges they have met and the hopes they have for the future. They encourage us to '**Rise, take your mat and walk**' with them as they continue their, often turbulent, journey towards full reconciliation.

World Day of Prayer is an international inter-church organisation which enables us to hear the thoughts of women from all parts of the world: their hopes, concerns and prayers. The preparation for the day is vast. An international committee is based in New York and there are national committees in each participating country. Regional conferences meet to consider the service and then local groups make their plans. Finally, at a church near you on **Friday 6 March 2020**, people will gather to celebrate the service prepared by the women of Zimbabwe.

The Day of Prayer is celebrated in over 170 countries. It begins in Samoa and prayer in native languages travels throughout the world --- through Asia, Africa, the Middle East, Europe and the Americas - before finishing in American Samoa more than 36 hours later.

When Spring comes

‘See! The winter is past; the rains are over and gone. Flowers appear on the earth; the season of singing has come, the cooing of doves is heard in our land.’ Song of Songs 2:11-12

March is the month that I associate with the coming of Spring, my favourite time of the year, and such a relief after the darkness and gloom of Winter. This verse beautifully describes the joy that most of us feel as the days begin to brighten, and Nature starts to awaken once again.

These words also speak to us about a new season in life, one that is filled with hope and expectation. Sometimes we experience the darkness of winter in our lives – maybe in the form of depression, bereavement, chronic illness, family difficulties, financial problems and so on. These long winter months of the soul may seem to last forever. Our joy disappears, our energy dissipates, our mood is low. A thick black cloud hangs over us and it seems as if the sun will never shine again.

Then we have this reminder that no season lasts for ever. The cold grip of Winter gradually thaws and gives way to warmer days. The sun does shine again, and the temperature rises. Birds sing and flowers blossom. The sap rises. Love is in the air.

And in the spiritual realm the same happens. Eventually we will enter a new season of the soul. Joy returns and life gets back to something like normality. No darkness lasts for ever. We experience our own awakening, a kind of mini resurrection. We start to feel alive again, to see possibilities and to dream again.

In the depths of Winter, we can look ahead to the certainty of Spring. Faith enables us to believe that the winter of the soul will soon be past as well. In the darkness we choose to hope in God.

200 years ago, on **10th March 1820** that the Royal Astronomical Society was founded in Britain.

175 years ago, on **17th March 1845** that one Henry Jones, a baker from Bristol, was granted a patent for his invention of self-raising flour.

90 years ago, on **12th March 1930** that Indian political spiritual leader Mahatma Gandhi led 78 activists and followers on a 23-day ‘salt march’ to protest against a British tax on salt and British rule in India. On 5th April he reached the sea and made salt, breaking British law. On 4th May he was arrested and imprisoned.

John thanked Gerald and his wife, who had ably supported him throughout, for his input, and for extending our knowledge of the town, in or near in which we live.

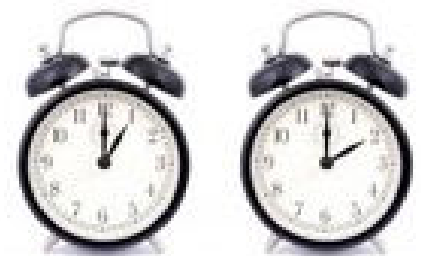

It was then time for refreshments, and Chris judged the competition for a Decorative Heart, which was won by Sally Aldous.

Whisky Caramel and Banana Self-Saucing Pudding

Ingredients

- 175g plain flour
- 100g golden caster sugar
- 1 tbsp baking powder
- 2 very ripe bananas, mashed, plus 1 whole, sliced
- 300ml milk
- 85g unsalted butter 85g, melted, plus a little for greasing the dish
- 1 beaten egg
- 1tp vanilla extract



CARAMEL TOPPING

- 150g soft dark brown sugar
- 4tbsp golden syrup
- 2 tbsp whisky

Method

Heat the oven to 180C/fan 160C/gas .

Combine the flour, sugar, baking powder and a pinch of salt in a large bowl.

Beat together the mashed bananas, milk, butter, egg and vanilla in a bowl, until well combined.

Gradually whisk the liquid mix into the flour mix to make a batter.

Butter a 7cm-deep, 26cm-wide baking dish and pour in the batter.

Topping

Place the sugar, golden syrup and 250ml of just-boiled water in a small pan and heat, stirring, until the sugar has dissolved.

Simmer then take off the heat and add the whisky.

Pour the mixture over the pudding (don't worry if it sinks), top with the sliced bananas then bake in the oven for 40-45 minutes or until you have a cooked sponge on top with a hot caramel sauce hidden beneath.

Serve hot with ice cream or custard, if you like.

what they could do.

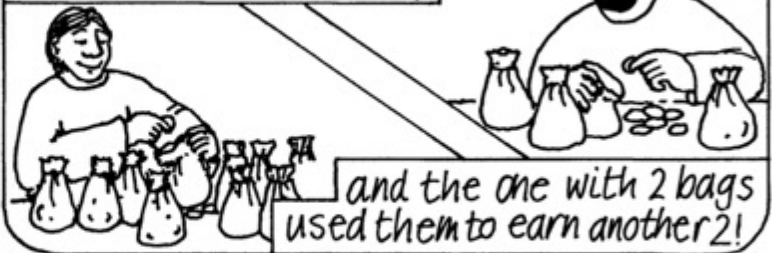


He gave 5 bags of coins to the
