Changing our Deaneries - a Consultation

Last week a consultation on a proposal to reduce the number of deaneries from 13 down to six was launched. All are welcome to contribute to this consultation, which will run **until Friday 4 December**.

It is proposed to move to six deaneries, with each having a mix of urban and rural and a town (or towns) working in partnership with their rural outlying areas.
